Match / Training Fees

The club requires all players to pay full membership fees this season of £240. This can also be paid in 12 monthly instalments of £20 per month for the period July 2011 to June 2012 inclusive. You can alternatively pay for the whole season by a single cheque for £240 or by 2 cheques of £120 each (the first due at the season start and the second due in January). This payment covers all training sessions and matches. *For families, the following payments will apply: 1st player as above, additional players £10 each per month or full payment of £120. If siblings are registering, a separate mandate for the each player **must** be completed. If you are unsure please contact the club secretary.*

This income is essential for the club to meet its regular financial commitments for training facilities, equipment and pitch fees, league & FA affiliations, player league registrations, player insurance, and ground maintenance.

If you wish to pay monthly, the club can only accept a Standing Order using the Standing Order mandate provided below, which is to be returned along with the completed registration forms. Please enter the name and address of your bank, your account name, number, bank sorting code, players name in reference box and complete the dates of the first payment.

If you wish to pay cheque, then the cheque should be made payable to 'Crawley Wasps Ladies FC' with the players name on the back, and is to be returned along with the completed registration forms.

Please note that we cannot accept the membership application without an accompanying cheque or the form below returned fully completed and signed.

CODES OF CONDUCT



It is the aim of Crawley Wasps LFC to promote the participation of girls in football. It is hoped that everyone will play to the best of their ability and that teams are successful. However, it is more important to enjoy football and play fairly. To this end, we ask players and parents/guardians to jointly endorse and uphold the following principles.

Respect Code of Conduct for Youth Players

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game. As a player, you have a big part to play. That's why The FA is asking every player to follow a Respect Code of Conduct.

When playing football, I will

- Always play to the best of my ability
- Play fairly – I won't cheat, complain or waste time.
- Respect my team-mates, the other team, the referee or my coach/manager.
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what my coach/team manager tells me
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may:

- Be required to apologise to my team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition:

- My club, County FA or The FA may make my parent or carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct
 - The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against my club.
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Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game. This club is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed in a safe, positive environment. Remember children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical and social skills. Winning isn't everything. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers at all times.

I will:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Remain outside the field of play and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake – mistakes are part of learning
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club



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CODES OF CONDUCT



Respect Code of Conduct for coaches, team managers and club officials

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

In the FA's survey of 37,000 grassroots participants, behaviour was the biggest concern in the game. This included the abuse of match officials and the unacceptable behaviour of over-competitive parents, spectators and coaches on the sideline. Play your part and observe the Football Association's Respect Code of Conduct in everything you do.

On and off the field, I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game
- Promote Fair Play and high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.

When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning
- Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me
- Ensure all parents/carers of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations
- Never engage in or tolerate any form of bullying
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, age and maturity
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interests.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may be:

- Required to meet with the club, league or County Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Monitored by another club coach
- Required to attend a FA education course
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- FACA membership withdrawn
- Required to leave or be sacked by the club.

In addition:

- My FACA (FA Coaches Association) membership may be withdrawn
