The club requires all players to pay membership fees this season of £276 or £228 (for players in full time education). This can also be paid in 12 monthly instalments of £22 per month or £19 per month for any player in full time education (this does include school, college & university) for the period July 2010 to June 2011 inclusive. The payment covers all training sessions and matches. *For families, the following payments will apply: 1st player as above, additional players £10 each. If siblings are registering, a separate mandate for the each player **must** be completed. If you are unsure please contact the club secretary*

We have agreed that this season you can do one complete payment for the entire season and if you would like to do this, it will be at the discounted price of £240 or £216 (for player in full time education) **but only** if you hand over a cheque before the 1st July 2010.

This monthly income is essential for the club to meet its regular financial commitments for training facilities, equipment and pitch fees, league & FA affiliations, player league registrations, and ground maintenance.

If you wish to monthly, the club can only accept a Standing Order using the Standing Order mandate provided below, which should be returned with the completed registration forms. CODES OF CONDUCT



It is the aim of Crawley Wasps LFC to promote the participation of girls in football. It is hoped that everyone will play to the best of their ability and that teams are successful. However, it is more important to enjoy football and play fairly. To this end, we ask players and parents/guardians to jointly endorse and uphold the following principles.

Respect Code of Conduct for Adult Players

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game. Players tell us they want a referee for every match, yet 7,000 match official's drop out each season because of the abuse and intimidation they receive on and off the pitch. Respect your referee today and you may just get one for every match this season. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for players at all times.

On and off the field, I will:

- Adhere to the Laws of The Game
- Display and promote high standards of behaviour
- Promote Fair Play
- Always respect the match officials decisions
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials
- Never engage in offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
- Never engage in bullying, intimidation or harassment
- Speak to my team-mates, the opposition and my coach/manager with respect.
- Remember we all make mistakes.
- Win or lose with dignity. Shake hands with the opposing team and the referee at the end of every game.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA.

I may:

- Be required to apologise to team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Receive a warning from the coach
- Receive a written warning from the club committee
- Be required to attend a FA education course
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Not be selected for the team
- Be required to serve a suspension
- Be fined
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.

CODES OF CONDUCT



Respect Code of Conduct for coaches, team managers and club officials

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

In the FA's survey of 37,000 grassroots participants, behaviour was the biggest concern in the game. This included the abuse of match officials and the unacceptable behaviour of over-competitive parents, spectators and coaches on the sideline. Play your part and observe the Football Association's Respect Code of Conduct in everything you do.

On and off the field, I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game
- Promote Fair Play and high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.

When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning
- Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me
- Ensure all parents/carers of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations
- Never engage in or tolerate any form of bullying
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, age and maturity
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interests.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may be:

- Required to meet with the club, league or County Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Monitored by another club coach
- Required to attend a FA education course
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- FACA membership withdrawn
- Required to leave or be sacked by the club.

In addition:

- My FACA (FA Coaches Association) membership may be withdrawn
